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Works like Untitled Shoe Project are once again incredibly seductive and playful, but also call to mind the implicit history of the shoe as

an object of desire. Throughout history shoes have been used to define a person's social status and cultural respectability, and Patterson's The New Hork Times series further reclaims the shoe as a vessel of decadence and artifice, bringing to mind the royal classes of Europe during the fifteen and sixteen hundreds when the upper classes decorated their shoes with brocades, feathers, flowers, jewels, silver and gold filaments to attract attention and delineate social standing. One has the sense that Patterson's shoes might have lightening bolts built into the soles as she is clearly on fire here!
